

Cost and availability of child care squeezing Colorado parents.

A majority of parents consider the cost of child care to be a serious problem in the state.




All Coloradans overwhelmingly support increasing state government investment to help reduce the cost of child care for working parents.




Pulse: The Colorado Health Foundation Poll was conducted July 27 - Aug. 16, 2021, online and by phone in English and Spanish.

For working parents, especially of young children, juggling child care comes at steep professional costs.

More than a quarter (27%) of all parents are unable to find child care for all the hours they needed it.

One in four of all parents have missed out on or declined professional opportunities because of a lack of child care.
