

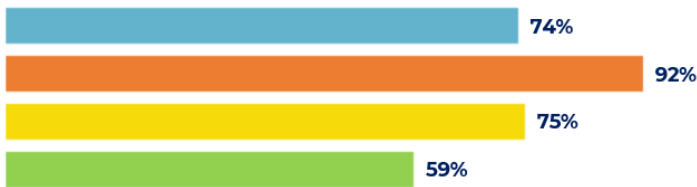
Across party lines, majority of Coloradans think policy change is an effective way to address the cost of living and lower housing costs.

● All Coloradans ● Democrats ● Independents ● Republicans

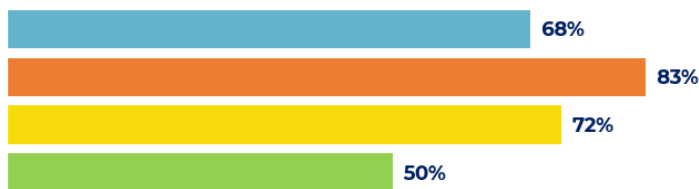
Making it easier for low-income people to enroll in programs that can help them to afford the costs of household expenses like food and health care
