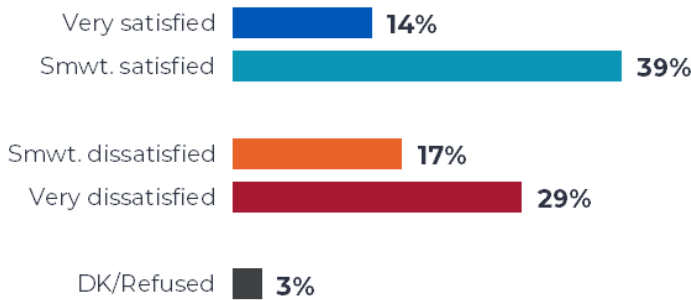


# Across party lines, many Coloradans shared doubts about the efficacy of state government.

Half of Coloradans say they are satisfied with how state government works for people like them, but few are “very satisfied.”



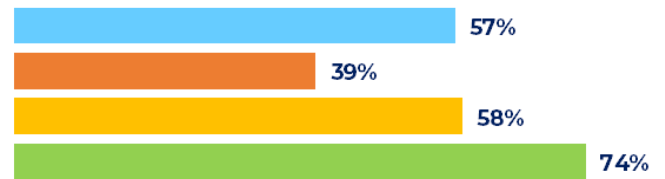
More than one-quarter say they or someone they know have been treated unfairly because of their race and ethnicity when interacting with government agencies. This is especially true for Native American and Black Coloradans.

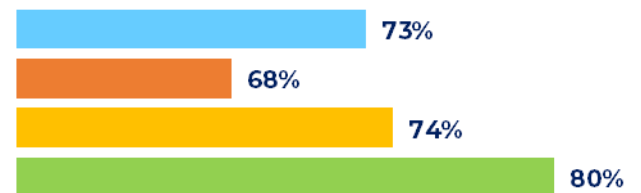
Here are some potential challenges that could keep Coloradans like you from being heard in state government. (% Major Challenge)

Republicans and independents are more likely than Democrats to say that policymakers have a limited understanding of the needs of people like them.



Political polarization and lack of compromise between political parties is also a major challenge across the political spectrum
